

## Instructions



1 You might need to trim the edges of the sheet if your printer left a white margin after printing.



2 Start with the printed side face down. Fold in half along the long length of the sheet.



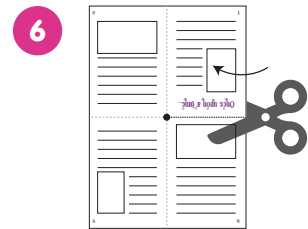
3 Then fold in half along the short length of the sheet.



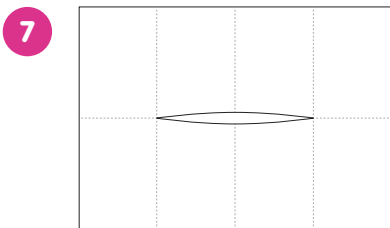
4 Fold in half along the short length of the sheet again.



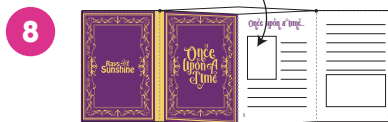
5 Unfold it back to the original sheet and you should now see creased lines that separate the sheet into 8 sections.



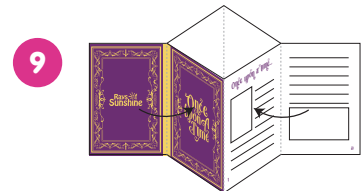
6 Fold in half across the middle. You will see a thicker black line with a dot at the end. Using scissors, cut down this black line up to the dot.



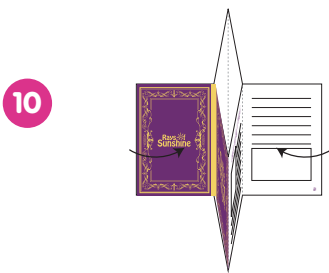
7 Unfold it again to the original sheet, and it should look like the picture above, with a slit running through the middle.



8 Fold in half along the long length of the sheet again.



9 Push the folded edges towards the centre, allowing the slit to open up into a diamond shape.



10 Keep pushing the edges towards the centre until the diamond disappears into another slit.



11 Keeping the slit tightly closed, fold over the four sides to make one small booklet in the correct page order (*the purple cover and back cover should be on the outside of the booklet*)

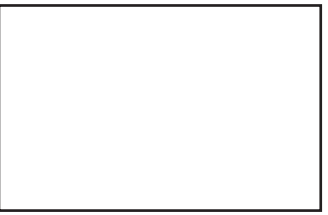


12 Create your own mini fairy tale by writing on the lines and drawing pictures in the boxes!

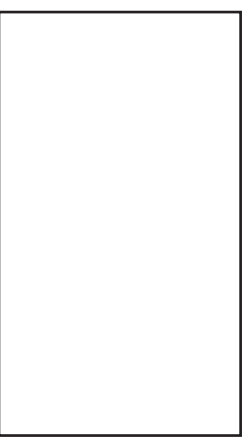

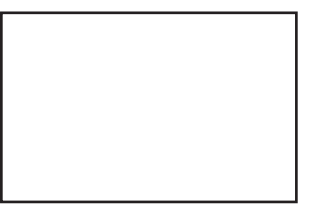
