Purpose of role

The Hospital Activity Volunteer at Rays of Sunshine will play a crucial role in bringing joy and comfort to children undergoing medical treatment. By organising and facilitating engaging activities, the volunteer will help create a positive and uplifting environment for young patients and their families.

Key Responsibilities:

- Plan and conduct a variety of activities, such as arts and crafts, games, and storytelling sessions, tailored to the interests and abilities of the children.
- Collaborate with hospital staff to ensure activities are safe and appropriate for the medical setting.
- Assist in setting up and cleaning up activity areas before and after sessions.
- Maintain a positive and encouraging atmosphere, fostering a sense of normalcy and fun for the children.
- Report any concerns or feedback to Sarah Osborne, Head of Wishes, to continuously improve the volunteer program.

What skills do I need to have?

- Friendly, you'll be an ambassador of Rays of Sunshine whilst volunteering with us
- Experience of working with children and young people (not essential but preferred)
- Be comfortable interacting with others (especially children and young people) to create a relaxed and positive experience for the wish child and their family
- Creativity and the ability to adapt activities to suit different age groups and abilities.



- Ability to problem solve and manage unexpected situations/last minute requests with a calm and professional manner
- Caring and empathic
- Ability to work collaboratively with hospital staff and other volunteers.

What training and support will I receive?

- All Rays of Sunshine staff and wish volunteers must complete the charity's Safeguarding Children training (mandatory)
- Only trained Rays of Sunshine team members and volunteers with a current DBS check can work with wish children (mandatory)
- Health and Safety Training (mandatory)
- The opportunity to shadow an experienced member of the Wish team to see a wish in progress.
